



Live to be Well

The federal definition of “marijuana”, allows hemp products to be available in stores around the country. The mature stalks, fiber, oil, and any other preparation of the Cannabis sativa L. plant are explicitly **exempt from classification as marijuana.** Under this exception, industrial hemp products, including hemp oil high in cannabidiol (or ^CBD), **are legal in the United States.**¹

^CBD oil derived from marijuana, which is high in THC, is considered a Schedule I drug. These illegal substances are completely **unrelated to our products.**

Our hemp products are considered food or dietary supplements. The ^CBD found in our products is a natural constituent of industrial hemp oil and is not synthetic or artificial. Therefore, our naturally derived, industrial hemp-based CBD is exempt from Schedule I just as any other constituent of non-psychoactive industrial hemp.²
